Mr. Schar,

The Office of the Governor is in receipt of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ's) request to temporarily suspend certain specified provisions in 30 TAC 335.5(b) and 335.6. TCEQ asserts that strict compliance with these laws could prevent, hinder, or delay necessary state efforts to respond to and cope with the declared wildfire disaster.

In accordance with section 418.016 of the Texas Government Code, the Office of the Governor grants TCEQ's request to temporarily suspend the specified provisions in 30 TAC 333.5(b) and 335.6, as set forth in TCEQ's request, to the extent that these provisions actually do prevent, hinder, or delay necessary state efforts to respond to declared wildfire disaster and efforts to cope with the declared disaster.

This suspension is in effect until terminated by the Office of the Governor or until the disaster declaration is lifted or expires.
